Tēnā tātou katoa,

Thank you to all the staff, whānau and students involved in Fia Fia night, which was held last Thursday. It was a great evening and students performed with pride. The food available was also well-received.

Also a big thank-you to everyone involved in the visit from the Yakushima students, particularly their school 'buddies', teachers and who included them in classes or provided courses, and to the homestay families. Also thank you to Mrs Lambrechts for organising the programme and to Mr Grant for working with the students. The students truly enjoyed their time in Dargaville and we look forward to hosting another group visiting next year.

A number of our students have been involved in competitions that have taken place over the last couple of weeks. The first of these was the Tai Tokerau Mathex competition in Whangarei. Although neither of teams were placed, they did well. On Wednesday, students were in the EPro8 Challenge Finals in Auckland. Coming up is the Senior Tourism class trip to Rotorua.

We have the school Open Evening and Subject Expo taking place on Thursday 29 August, with planning for this well underway. There will be a number of displays and tours will be available until 6pm.

We have changed the name of Academic Coaching to Hui Whānau. These will take place on the 5th and 6th of September. The Hui Whānau are a good opportunity to meet and discuss the progress of your child(ren) as well as next steps. It will also be possible to make appointments to see subject teachers. More information about the Hui Whānau is included in the newsletter. The second round of co-requisite examinations will be taking place over a number of days, starting in the week beginning Monday 9 September. Students will be informed if they are sitting these assessments and the timetable for this. Also the senior school examinations start on Monday September 18. As I have shared previously, these examinations are important, both as a gauge of preparedness, but also to assist with preparing a derived grade if one is required. Students should be studying in preparation for these.

Next week, we will be conducting student wellbeing surveys with a number of students from every year level. If you do not consent to your child participating in this survey, please let the school office know before Tuesday 20th August.

As I have spoken about previously, our focus on attendance continues as does showing respect. Respect in a nutshell, is about treating other people how you want to be treated yourself. This includes greeting people and showing good manners; using 'please' as well as 'thank you' make a big different.
