Trustee Treasure

What can you do if you are worried about your child's learning?

Talk with your child. This is the best way to understand what's happening for them. Together you can take time to decide what the issue is, how big the issue is for them, and what it means for their learning.

Who to contact? If your child is having trouble with a specific subject, then arrange to meet with their subject teacher. They will be able to help you with your child's progress and formulate a plan which will help them catch up to their year group or to their expected levels with learning.

If the teacher uses education terms you don't understand, ask them to explain them. Make sure when the meeting ends you have understood everything so that you're in the best position to help your child.

Any plan you, your child and your child's teacher decide on should have some long-term and short-term learning goals, actions for the teacher and perhaps some actions for home.
