Before the end of the term, we have the Peer Support Camp. On Wednesday the 27th March, Year 9 students will be at Adrenaline Park participating in activities such as raft building and paddle boarding, along with other pursuits led by the Year 13 Peer Support Leaders.

Other upcoming events include the North Island Secondary Schools Volleyball competition, and we are finalising a date for the school athletics.

Attendance and uniform remain important focuses for the school. I am pleased to say that the uniform is looking tidy at present and attendance is currently tracking ahead of previous years.
