

# Digital Technology

#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course involves using a variety of software to create solutions for problems. The Year 10 course will cover presentation software, using ICT as a promotion tool, an introduction to programming, robotics and computational thinking. Students who take this course will need to be creative, willing to explore their own ideas and work using their own initiative. To make this course work for you, you have to be the type of person who enjoys using computer software to produce a quality solution to a problem or brief.

#### COURSE TITLE

### Visual Art

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This is a broad, multimedia course that will provide students with the opportunity to develop practical skills and creativity. Students will gain knowledge of painting and drawing techniques, Photoshop/Digital Art and printmaking processes. Students will investigate the work of Artist Models and use what they have learnt to develop their own ideas. Students will find that they will develop both art making and critical thinking skills. This will form a vital stepping stone towards studying NCEA Level 1 Visual Arts. Different Visual Arts specialities are offered at Level 2 and 3.

#### Food and Nutrition

#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is about helping students to make informed decisions about food and the choices that will contribute to their own well-being (hauora) and that of other people. This includes knowledge and understanding of the nutritional needs of people, lifestyles and cultures. Students will learn about food purchasing and how to budget and extend family meals. They will prepare food from many different cultures and also create less food waste. Students will create a 'My Food Bag' and trial and test out their skills at home for their whānau. This course has a weekly practical component but students need to know that hygiene, planning and preparation and cleaning are required for all practical lessons.

## **Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award**

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

The Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award is a prestigious programme that runs in countries all around the globe and is now running as a timetabled class for Year 10 students at Dargaville High. Students earn the Award through a combination of community service, physical recreation, and development in an appropriate skill or skills. The final section of the Award is an 'Adventurous Journey', likely a challenging multi-hour tramp somewhere in the northern North Island with an overnight stay in a tent or hut. Students will carry their own gear and completing the Adventurous Journey will require a high level of fitness which students can work on throughout the semester. As an Award participant, students will have the chance to:

- Design their own Award programme;
- Set their own goals and record their progress;
- Make a positive impact on the lives of others through community service;
- Learn valuable practical and social skills for career development;
- Connect with other Award participants at home and abroad.

Students can continue with activities they're already taking part in, such as sports or volunteering, and count these towards achieving their Award, or their Award could be an opportunity to try something new and develop a passion for something different. Students who complete the Bronze Award can go on to complete the Silver and Gold Awards at a later date.

#### Music

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course develops and broadens the student's skills in music and New Zealand music history, general musical knowledge and performance. Students learn to read music, study different genres of music and participate in group and solo performances. All Music students need to learn one or more instruments, either with itinerant school music teachers or private lessons outside school. Students must have an instrument at home to practise on. The course is a foundation that will prepare students who wish to study Music for NCEA Level 1 in Year 11.

#### COURSE TITLE

#### Commerce

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course provides an introduction to aspects of Financial Literacy and teaches students how to manage their money, how to budget, their rights as a consumer and what rights they have if they borrow money, how tax works and how to read a payslip, what an entrepreneur is and does, how money flows around the economy and the difference between needs and wants. The aim is to give practical, everyday skills and knowledge students can use, whether or not they continue with Commerce into Year 11.

# French

#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

Bonjour, tout le mondel While this course builds on the French language students learned in Year 9, complete beginners to French are also welcome. In our French class, the focus is on developing real-life communication skills through talking about ourselves and our lives, going shopping or to the doctor, planning a trip around France, etc. We also experience authentic aspects of French and francophone (French-speaking) culture through foods, music videos, songs, movies, and short written texts. The most important thing you can bring is a willingness to get involved - don't worry about making mistakes because that is how we learn! There is a cost of \$8 to go towards a French To Go workbook; the remaining costs will be met by the French department.

#### Drama

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Students studying this course will become familiar with and incorporate dramatic techniques and conventions into their creative work. Through both scripted and improvised contexts students will explore and develop performance skills. In addition to performance, following on from Year 9 Dance, we include elements of dance into Drama. Students should be prepared to participate in all activities and make contributions to group work.

This is an introductory course that will prepare students for NCEA Level 1 and Level 2 Drama, which involves a more-in-depth study of particular acting styles and theatre.

#### COURSE TITLE

### Te Reo Māori

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course takes students through proficiency tests in korero (speaking), whakarongo (listening), panui (reading), tuhituhi (writing) and is an extension of the content covered in the Year 9 course. The course will include tikanga (protocols and customs) related to the kaupapa (programme) being taught. This will assist students in the preparation for NCEA Level 1, which covers the curriculum areas of speaking, listening, writing and reading in Te Reo Māori. The subject should be taken for both semesters, however, consideration for Semester 2 entrance will be given to students who show proficiency in Te Reo Māori.

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**
